

## OBJECTIVES




- to explore and deepen the topic of digital youth work, digital citizenship, the new methods related to European digital transition policies (DIGCOMP / DIGCOMPEDU);

- Build a network of ambassadors of digital youth work that will share and bring quality, new methodologies and digital approaches to others youth workers.


## SUMMARY

# Financial procedure for travel reimbursement

## NOTICE

The travel reimbursement will be done by bank transfer only to the partner organization accounts for their group of participants or to one of the participants involve who will take responsibility, according to the rules by the National Agency.

The reimbursement will be done **ONLY** when the following steps are done:

- Collect and provide the invoices; tickets (there must be a price, name of the person and mean of payment stated on it);
- All boarding passes;
- Mobility report filled by the participant.



**TICKETS** will be reimbursed considering only the official address of the sending organisation.

For ex:

If the city of official address of the sending organisation is Berlin.

**BERLIN-CAGLIARI**= It will be reimbursed

**MONACO-BERLIN**= it won't be reimbursed, since just the travel from Berlin can be reimbursed and **NOT** how to reach Berlin airport.


## Hostel Marina

# ABOUT CAGLIARI



Cagliari is an Italian municipality and the capital of the island of Sardinia, an autonomous region of Italy. Cagliari's Sardinian name Casteddu means castle. It has about 155,000 inhabitants, while its metropolitan city (including Cagliari and 16 other nearby municipalities) has more than 431,000 inhabitants. Cagliari is the 26th largest city in Italy and the largest city on the island of Sardinia.



Historical sites include the prehistoric Domus de Janas, very damaged by cave activity, a large Carthaginian era necropolis, a Roman era amphitheatre, a Byzantine basilica, three Pisan-era towers and a strong system of fortification that made the town the core of Spanish Habsburg imperial power in the western Mediterranean Sea. Its natural resources have always been its sheltered harbour, the often powerfully fortified hill of Castel di Castro, the modern Casteddu, the salt from its lagoons.

The city of Cagliari is situated in the south of Sardinia, overlooking the centre of the eponymous gulf, also called Golfo degli Angeli ("Bay of Angels") after an ancient legend. The city is spread over and around the hill of the historic district of Castello and nine other limestone hills of the middle-to-late Miocene, unique heights of a little more than 100 metres (330 ft) above sea level on the long plains of Campidano.
